## The Parable of the Great Banquet

<sup>15</sup> When one of those at the table with him heard this, he said to Jesus, "Blessed is the one who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God."

<sup>16</sup> Jesus replied: "A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. <sup>17</sup> At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.'

<sup>18</sup> "But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, 'I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me.'

<sup>19</sup> "Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me.'

20 "Still another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.'

<sup>21</sup> "The servant came back and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and ordered his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame.'

<sup>22</sup> "Sir,' the servant said, 'what you ordered has been done, but there is still room.' <sup>23</sup> "Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full. <sup>24</sup> I tell you, not one of those who were invited will get a taste of my banquet.'" Luke 14:15-24

If someone were to approach you on the street and invited you to come to a banquet, held by a local dignitary, dressed as you are, right now, how would you react? Would your first reaction be one of surprise, wariness, excitement, delight, honoured or cared for or would you turn the invitation down?

We are not told how many people readily accepted the invitation or if any refused, but would your reaction have been different if you knew that it was Jesus who was host?

### A short reflection on the food we are eating

What is it about the food that you have chosen that you particularly like?

Is it something that you eat often or something for a special occasion?

Take time to think about - look appeal, texture, taste and smell.

Think about the elements that make the food that you are enjoying and what is the Holy Spirit saying to you through them?

To give an example, when putting this together I chose plain crisps as I don't eat them very often so they are a bit of a luxury and relatively easy to cope with ingredient wise, there being only three, potato, sunflower oil and salt.

Potatoes – solid, different sizes, nourishing, comforting, filling satisfying,

Sunflower oil – reminded me of the brightness of the sunflower heads, cheering, joyful, beautiful, full of seeds for future growth,

Salt – gives flavour and from the Bible "Salt is good, but if it loses its saltiness, how can you make it salty again? Have salt among yourselves, and be at peace with each other." Mark 9:50 Maybe you have chosen something natural or maybe it has been manufactured in some way. Take time now to thank God for his provision of all things to you, and also be thankful to those who have been part of the chain of bringing food to market – growers, harvesters, manufacturers, delivery vans etc and retail staff.

Please now take about 10minutes to sit quietly and listen to God for words and pictures for the Church and for one another. If you receive something for an individual that you are confident to share with them, please do.
