
LiFT Online No 7 - September 2020

The Living Stone and a Chosen People

⁴ As you come to him, the living Stone—rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to him— ⁵ you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house^[a] to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For in Scripture it says:

"See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame."[b] 1 Peter 2:4-6 NIV

⁴ The Lord Jesus is the living stone. ^[a] The people of the world decided that they did not want this stone. But he is the one God chose as one of great value. So come to him. ⁵ You also are like living stones, and God is using you to build a spiritual house. ^[b] You are to serve God in this house as holy priests, offering him spiritual sacrifices that he will accept because of Jesus Christ. ⁶ The Scriptures say,

"Look, I have chosen a cornerstone of great value, and I put that stone in Zion.

Anyone who trusts in him will never be disappointed."

<u>Easy</u> to Read Version

Perhaps, and if you have time, or when you are gardening, take time to look at the stones strewn upon the earth. How big are they, how many, are they all the same? Wonder, at their story. Perhaps as you do so, you might take time to reflect on your own story and your journey with God and how we can serve God as living stones together.
