Since I bought a twig tree with especially bright lighting, I have been fascinated by the way that the light falls on clear baubles. Above are two photographs taken of two baubles in daylight. If you look more closely on the one on the left, it is just about possible to make out a distorted layout of our hallway! The one on the right, a mish mash of colour.

The two pictures below are of the same baubles but taken in the darkness with just the light shining directly onto them. There seems to be more clarity in the detail.



Maybe you might like to make similar comparisons by lighting a candle in daylight and observing the flicker of the flame, the way it reacts to the daylight surrounding it and then relighting it at a later time when the lights can be extinguished and it becomes the lone light in the darkness. What are the patterns made by the light and how far does light spread? How much of the surroundings become illuminated?
