3-stage approach:

- 1- residential counselling, keyworking - groups. Training, local work
- 2- semi-independent counselling, keyworking - groups. independent living skills community voluntary work
- 3- supported accommodation counselling, keyworking - groups. Training, local work

Just Around the Corner (JAC) Ltd is a registered charity (1998) based in Berkshire UK engaged with young people and their families. They enable them to make positive choices. JAC also works in schools in towns around Wokingham, supporting and mentoring struggling students. Rehoboth (near Wokingham) is a centre that uses equine assisted learning and other activities, such as arts and crafts, as therapies for children and young people, who are often referred from local schools.

LAMB is an Integrated Rural Health & Development Project, including a 100-bed general hospital and an extensive community health programme. They show Christian concern for the poor and under-privileged, especially for women and children. They train key health staff.



LAMB Health raises finance for the LAMB Poor Fund for the relief of poverty, sickness and disability. They promote its model of integrated health care and community development.

LAMB programmes encourage safer deliveries, delay in the age of marriage for teenagers, mental well-being and greater awareness of the danger of floods. The training centre offers practical and academic courses for rural health workers, nurses and midwives working in rural clinics and hospitals.

Kimbilio Children's Sanctuary in the D.R Congo

Helping children build a future with hope, supporting street children in Lubumbashi, D.R. Congo



Kimbilio, which means sanctuary in Swahili, has been working with children living on the streets of Lubumbashi in the south of the DRC since 2009. They help them overcome their personal challenges and begin to build a future with hope.

The charity is administered from the UK by Ian Harvey. The Congolese staff team, under the Anglican Diocese, run a day centre offering a rehabilitation programme with education and training in health and nutrition. Kimbilio also seeks to reunite children with their families wherever possible and appropriate. Two homes help children in transit and two more offer longer term accommodation on a site that also includes a chapel and a newly opened school serving local community as well as the homes. The four key areas of service provision are prevention,
