Easter Eggs and Coffee!

Eco Prayer for this week



South Sudan

Around 7 m people face extreme hunger as the rainy season approaches & food stocks run low; over half a million have entered S.Sudan to escape the civil war in its northern neighbour. In over-crowded camps, 300 often share a single tap. Pray for increased aid, agencies responding and for peace in Sudan.

Middle East

Pray for an end to the terrible suffering in Gaza. A quarter of population are "One step from famine" and risk their lives queuing for food-aid. Pray for hostage release, for a cease-fire and for increased delivery of food, water and medicines & safety of those who distribute aid. Pray especially for Palestinian Christians.

World Peace.

UN chief Antonio Guterres warned this week that "conflicts are taking a terrible toll as parties to war trample on human rights and humanitarian law". The war in Ukraine enters its third year and conflicts rage in Gaza, DRC, Sudan, Yemen, Mali and Myanmar. Pray for peace in our troubled world & for those who work towards it.

Water & Sanitation

Around the world, 3.5 billion people still do not have access to a safe, clean toilet. Partly as a result, 16 countries are fighting cholera outbreaks and world vaccine stocks are running out. Pray for agencies like TearFund and Christian Aid, working with partners to provide this basic need.
